1 Choose your moment. From debating other candidates in your campaign for class president to catching up with a friend after school, you've got tons of opportunities to share your feelings and learn about how others view the world.

2 Make a case. Your feelings are super strong, but you'll be more successful changing the way others see the world if you back up the feelings with facts! Find out the who, what, when, where, why, and how of your issue, and make sure to weave them into your conversation.

3 But keep it real. Not everything you hear from friends, see on TV, or read about online is true. Avoid spreading confusing information by making sure any information you share about your cause has been verified by multiple trusted sources.

4 Stay open. Tuning out or avoiding people with different beliefs won't do much to help your cause! People who see things differently aren't necessarily bad or wrong. Be respectful and avoid making assumptions. It's possible they don't have all the information you do or they hadn't thought about the issue from a certain angle. Explain why you care, but also listen to what they have to say. The two of you may still disagree in the end, but at least you'll be on your way to finding common ground, and maybe a new solution that could make both sides happy.
