Research at Girl Scouts of the USA and the Juliette Gordon Low Birthplace is by application and appointment, facilitated through the Girl Scout National Historic Preservation Center. Access to archive materials at Girl Scouts of the USA and Juliette Gordon Low Birthplace will be under the control and supervision of the Archivist or designated staff member.

Archives User Policy

General Regulations concerning access to the Girl Scout National Historic Preservation Center (NHPC) and Juliette Gordon Low Birthplace (JGLB) Archival Collections:

- Researchers may use the Archives only after completing the Research Application and receiving authorization from the NHPC Archivist or designee. Be thorough in completing the Research Application so that records can be retrieved in advance of your visit.
- 2. Access to records is governed by the access policy of the Archives. Material is issued to researchers subject to any specific conditions relating to individual collections and/or United States Copyright Law.
- 3. Archival access does not confer on Researchers any right to incorporate Archival material into any publication; no publication (print, web, film, etc.) of Archival material is permitted without written permission of Girl Scouts of the USA (GSUSA). If GSUSA approves the usage, the publication must attribute the material source as specified by GSUSA. Moreover, Girl Scouts of the USA may condition such approval on the use of disclaimers or other language in publications if, in the sole discretion of GSUSA, such language is necessary to clarify that a work is not authorized, endorsed or licensed by Girl Scouts of the USA.
- 4. Archival access and research assistance provided to an author by the Girl Scout National Historic Preservation Center NHPC Archivists does not make a publication authorized, endorsed or licensed. As noted above, Girl Scouts of the USA may require authors using the NHPC Archives or materials from the Archives to use disclaimers or other language in their publications if, in the sole discretion of Girl Scouts of the USA, such language is necessary to clarify that a work is not authorized, endorsed or licensed by Girl Scouts of the USA. Researchers agree to comply with any such requirements of GSUSA. Please be sure that you have informed your publisher, if applicable, of these requirements.

COPYRIGHT INFORMATION

GSUSA does not own the copyright in all materials in its archival and library collections. Copies made, either by researcher or NHPC or JGLB staff from the archival and library collections of the Girl Scout National Historic Preservation Center or Juliette Gordon Low Birthplace may be protected by United States Copyright Law (Title 17 of the United States Code, accessible for review at www.copyright.gov) governing reproduction, distribution, public display and certain other uses of protected works. Use may be allowed with permission from the rights holder; some uses are considered fair use. The user of the archival material is responsible for compliance with the law.



Materials use Rules Regulations concerning access to the Girl Scout National Historic Preservation Center (NHPC) and Juliette Gordon Low Birthplace (JGLB) Archival Collections:

- 1. No eating or drinking is permitted near research materials or in the research area(s).
- 2. No bags, briefcases, coats or enclosed containers are to be taken into the research Area.
- 3. Pencils must be used for handwritten notes. Fountain pens, ballpoints, felt tips, highlighters and other pens and correction fluid are not permitted in the Research Area, as they contain substances that can cause serious damage to records.
- 4. Laptop computers may be used. There is guest wireless available at Girl Scout National Headquarters in New York for researcher use.
- 5. Reproduction of assets digitally for research purposes (with iPhone, BlackBerry, cell phones, digital camera, etc.) is only allowed with permission from Archivist or designee. Personal portable desktop scanners may not be used.
- 6. In general, Archival material may be photocopied at NHPC; at JGLB photo copies are at the sole discretion of the staff. If assets are too fragile, requests for photocopies may be denied. Duplication is subject to the condition of assets and copyright restrictions.
- 7. Archivist or designee can facilitate copies, and upon occasion scans, of records for a fee. Researcher can prepare materials for photocopying by placing a strip of acid free paper in front of the page to be copied, or by rotating the document the opposite direction of the folder, keeping it in the folder. Instructions will be given Archivist or designee to researcher as to appropriate method for identifying items to be duplicated, which may vary depending on asset collection. Permission for copies of assets for research does not grant permission for use for publication or any other use. Permission for use beyond research must be by special application.
- 8. No archival material is to be removed from the Research Area by the researcher.
- 9. Only one volume, box of records, or folder at a time will be issued to each researcher. The researcher must return materials to the Archivist or designed as soon as he/she has finished using them to retrieve the next set of records.
- 10. Researchers must handle all records carefully and must not mark, fold, tear, or otherwise harm the records. Researchers must not rearrange or interfere in any way with the order of archival material.
- 11. While viewing photographs, gloves must be worn to protect the assets. Gloves are available from the Archivist or designee handling researcher's visit.
- 12. Hand creams, moisturizers, oils and nail polish can harm archival records and textiles, which may not be immediately apparent, but damage can appear over time. Please ask the Archivist for gloves to handle all materials if you use these products.
- 13. If you accidentally damage material or believe there are missing items within a file, or notice deterioration or damage that needs attention, please alert the archives staff.
- 14. Other guidelines, as applicable to access to some archival assets, may be required at the sole discretion of the archivist. Please note that some collections may only be viewed with the archivist or designee.
