GIRL SCOUT TRADITIONS

Bridging

Bridging is a beloved Girl Scout tradition that honors girls' achievements throughout the year and celebrates their "crossing the bridge" to the next Girl Scout level. It involves a special ceremony for the whole family to enjoy as you reflect on the past and prepare for the future.

This is how bridging works:

- Grade 1 Daisies bridge to Brownies
- Grade 3 Brownies bridge to Juniors
- Grade 5 Juniors bridge to Cadettes
- Grade 8 Cadettes bridge to Seniors
- Grade 10 Seniors bridge to Ambassadors

- Grade 12 Ambassadors bridge to Adult Members

As girls progress through each level of Girl Scouting, they become more confident, get to know themselves better, continue to learn and master a ton of new skills, and enjoy countless more adventures! GSNETX POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Male Volunteers

Girl Scout troops are designed to be inclusive and family-oriented so that adult family members - both male and female - feel welcome to volunteer and partner with each other to create a troop dynamic that fosters a positive Girl Scouting experience for every girl in the troop. Here are a few details to make it easier for dads, uncles, grandfathers, and other male role models to be Man Enough to be a Girl Scout!

Men who are troop leaders

- May have a male co-leader but must have one unrelated female registered volunteer with an eligible background check present at all troop meetings.
- At least two registered and background checked female volunteers must attend for overnights, camping trips, extended trips, or events.

Male volunteers attending campouts

- Must be a registered member with an eligible background check.
- Housing spaces for men are available at GSNETX properties. These spaces can be reserved in the camp reservation system when the campout reservation is made, pending availability.
For non-council camp facilities, a separate sleeping area apart from youth members must be designated for men.
- May serve as **additional** First Aiders and Troop Camp Trained adults.
*Due to the location of the designated sleeping facilities for men at GSNETX camps, registered volunteers who are men **cannot** be counted as Safety-Wise ratio adults or serve as the **primary** Troop Camp Trained Adult or First Aider.*
- A minimum of two unrelated Safety-Wise adults who are women must always participate in overnight activities involving volunteers who are men.

During overnight activities not taking place at GSNETX camps:

- It may be appropriate for registered volunteers who are men to be counted as Safety-Wise ratio adults if more than two adults are required to meet youth-to-adult safety ratios.
- It may be appropriate for a man to serve as the primary Troop Camp Trained adult or First Aider if he is able to be easily contacted and provide assistance quickly during sleeping hours.
If this assistance requires that he enter sleeping quarters designated for youth or women for any reason, one of the Safety-Wise volunteers who is a woman must be present at all times. If a volunteer who is a man is not able to be easily contacted

or if the facility has rules that would prevent this type of supervision or interaction, he may not serve in these roles.

- **Troop Financial Report (TFR) is now LIVE!** Log into MY GS, click on My Account, and select the Volunteer Toolkit (VTK). Once you are in the VTK, click on the Finances tab. **Due June 15.**
 - New troops beginning balance will be \$0.
 - You will be reporting finances from June 1, 2021 or when your troop started to May 31, 2022.
 - Use the [Troop Financial Ledger](#) to track and share the troop's spending and income with your girls and their families. It is designed to work in conjunction with the annual TFR found in the VTK.
